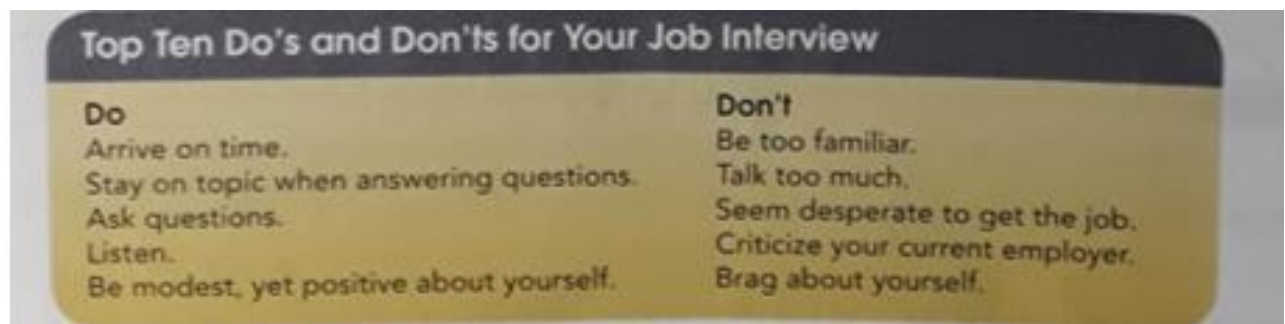

A collocation is two or more words that often go together. These combinations (for example collocations with "principal") just sound "right" to native English speakers, who use them all the time. On the other hand, other combinations of "principal" may be unnatural and just sound "wrong". Using collocations list of "principal" improves your English, especially your English speaking skills, and increases your vocabulary words in English.
