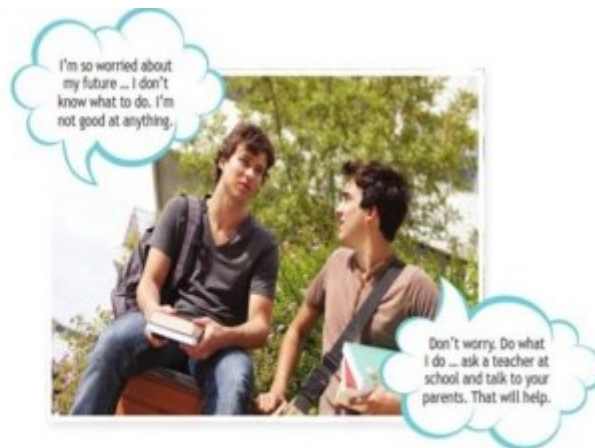

an auxiliary verb (such as can, must, might, may) that is characteristically used with a verb of predication and expresses a modal modification and that in English differs formally from other verbs in lacking -s and -ing forms.

MODAL	EXAMPLES	USES
CAN	He can find any street in London. You can take a taxi. Can you take me to Victoria Station?	Ability Suggestion Request
BE ABLE TO	He is able to find any street in London.	Ability
CAN'T	That story can't be true.	Certainty that something is impossible
COULD	I could play tennis when I was younger. Could you take me to Victoria Station? You could take a taxi.	Ability Request Suggestion
MAY	It may be quicker to travel by train. May I come in?	Possibility Formal request/ Permission
MIGHT	It might be quicker to travel by train.	Possibility
MUST	You must be back at 10 o'clock. Look at the snow. It must be cold outside.	Obligation Certainty that something is true.
HAVE TO	You have to be back at 10 o'clock.	Obligation
NEED TO	You need to study a lot.	Obligation.
NEEDN'T	You needn't have a university degree.	Lack of obligation.
MUSN'T	You mustn't drive without a license.	Prohibition
DON'T HAVE TO	You don't have to call a taxi.	Lack of obligation
SHOULD	You should drive more carefully.	Opinion/Advice
OUGHT TO	You ought to drive more carefully.	Opinion/Advice

- Nine on-campus residence halls; most students live on campus.
- Started as a private college for women; changed to a coeducational institution in 1969.
- One of the largest undergraduate library collections in the world; has many special collections, including that of Albert Einstein.
- 85% of graduates decide to enroll in a program of higher study within five years of graduation.
- Vassar students can tailor-make their own program with the Independent Major, which allows students to form their own program suited to their needs, or the Self-Instructional Language Program, which offers many non-traditional languages like Swahili and Yiddish.
- Students are encouraged to study abroad, and usually do this for a semester or two during their junior year.
- Offers many NCAA Division III varsity athletic programs (no football or hockey).
- There is an alumni database of over 3,000 people who offer help and advice to Vassar students or prospective students.

- Harvard is the oldest institution for higher education in the U.S., the most well known of the Ivy League schools, also the first and oldest corporation in the U.S.
- Mostly known for its postgraduate programs which include schools of business, law, and medicine.
- 41 NCAA Division I varsity teams (more than any other university in the U.S.); athletic scholarships not offered.
- The library is the largest academic library in the U.S., and one of the five largest in the world.
- Harvard Art Museums own many world-famous collections.
- Housing includes dorms for freshmen, and 12 residential houses for other undergraduates. Each includes space for tutors, dining halls, libraries, and other student facilities.
- The Harvard Crimson is the oldest college newspaper in the U.S. Past editors include many Pulitzer Prize winners and two Presidents (John F. Kennedy and Franklin D. Roosevelt).
