You're not sure and want to check something:

You haven't seen her *show* yet, *have* you?

You're sure and think someone will agree:

It's *amazing*, *isn't* it?

Tag questions are statements followed by short questions in the same tense, called "tags."**Affirmative statement + negative tag**It's amazing, **isn't it?**That was a dumb thing to do, **wasn't it?**She won the talent show, **didn't she?**He's dropped out of sight, **hasn't he?****Answer yes to agree.**She won the talent show, **didn't she?****Yes, she did.****Negative statement + affirmative tag**It's not easy to become famous, **is it?**That wasn't too smart, **was it?**She didn't have connections, **did she?**His career hasn't taken off, **has it?****Answer no to agree.**That wasn't too smart, **was it?****No, it wasn't.**
