Bargain hunting

Do the shopping

"Jack and I generally do the shopping together on Saturday mornings."

Go shopping

Go to the shops to buy things.

"She's gone shopping - I've no idea when she'll be back!"

Fitting room

A place to try on clothes to see if they fit or suit you.

"I need your opinion. Will you come with me to the fitting room?"

I can't afford it

Not have enough money to buy something.

"I'd love that jacket but I can't afford it!"

In stock/out of stock

Be available or unavailable in a shop or store.

"I'm very sorry. I'm afraid the coulour you want is **out of stock.**"

It costs a fortune!

Be very expensive.

"Look at the price of that bag - it costs a fortune!"

It costs an arm and a leg!

Cost a lot of money; be very expensive.

"The diamond engagement ring cost an arm and a leg!"

It's a steal!

So cheap that it's almost as if you haven't paid anything for it.

"At that price it's a steal. You won't find one cheaper in any other shop."

It's good value for money.

Worth the money spent on it.

"The quality is excellent so it's good value for money."

Receipt

A piece of paper given in a shop as proof that you have paid for an article. (US: sales slip)

"If you keep the **receipt** you'll be able to exchange the article."

Refund

Money paid back to a customer who is not satisfied with an article purchased.

"You must produce the receipt if you want to get a refund."

Summer or Winter sales

A period in the year when articles are sold at a reduced price.

"The kids need new winter coats but I'll try and wait until the sales to buy them."

Shop assistant

A person who serves customers in a shop

"The **shop assistant** was extremely patient while my mother tried on several pairs of shoes."

Shop till you drop

Go shopping for a very long time, until you are exhausted.

"If you go to London with Ashley, you'll **shop till you drop**, so take comfortable shoes!"

Shopaholic

Love shopping so much that it is like an addiction

"Sophie's favourite pastime is shopping - she's a complete **shopaholic**!"

Spend money

Use money to purchase an article or service

""We **spent** a lot of **money** on excursions during our trip.

Take something back.

Return something that you have bought

"The hair dryer didn't work properly so she **took** it **back** to the shop."

That's a bit pricey!

It's a bit expensive.

"Their clothes are a bit pricey but they have a wonderful selection."

Window shopping

Look at things in shop windows, without actually purchasing anything.

"I haven't been paid yet, so I can only go window shopping"

Shopping is a necessary part of life which very few people can avoid. It is a daily routine for some people. Some people shop for pleasure while other people go shopping just to buy the necessary items in order to survive. The weekend is usually a good time to go shopping because people have free time from work. At this time the shops are usually very busy because people try to get the best items for the lowest price before the item runs out of stock.

Some people go shopping more regularly than other people to browse products in shops even when they do not have much money. This is known as window shopping and allows people to plan ahead and save for the things they want to buy in the future or wait for the items to drop in price. Some people spend a lot of time looking for bargains while others do not think of the price and are happy to spend a lot. Some people believe that the more expensive the item, the better the quality, but this is not always true. It is sensible to buy items which are affordable, but some people use a credit card or borrow money from the bank so that they can buy the items they really want rather than wait for it.

Sometimes shopping can be stressful when choosing a gift to buy other people for a special occasion. It is common to buy a gift voucher so that a friend or loved one can go shopping themselves at their own convenience. Shopping online is often popular with people who have a busy lifestyle. People are able to order their necessary and luxury items from the comfort of their own home, or even on the move. Delivery is usually free and items are often cheaper than in shops on the high street. The only real problem is that the item description and quality may be different than what they hoped for. This could mean the customer may become disappointed with the item they receive and will need to return it at their own cost. People who go to shops to do their shopping often use self-service payment machines. This usually saves time as the shopper does not need to join a long queue. However, it can be frustrating when the machine has a problem and the sales assistant is not always available to help.
