FASE DE CONSTRUCCIÓN

PRESENT CONTINUOUS SPELLING RULES

El presente continuo o presente progresivo se forma con el Verbo to be y otro verbo al que se le agrega -ing, que es lo que en gramática se llama el gerundio. En español es la terminación -ando -endo (cantando, riendo).

Reglas

- Verbs that end in -e (make / write etc.) → ing:

make → making write → writing drive → driving

Los verbos que terminan en -e (make / write etc) quitan la -e

Make - making (hacer - haciendo) write - writing (escribir- escribiendo)

- Sometimes a word ends in a vowel + a consonant. For example: get, run, swim. Before adding -ing, the consonant at the end is 'doubled'.

get → getting run → running swim → swimming

Algunas veces una palabra que termina en vocal + una consonante. Por ejemplo: ge, run, swim. Antes de agregar -ing, la consonante final se dobla.

Get - getting run - running swim - swimming
Lograr - logrando correr - corriendo nadar - nadando

- Do NOT double the letter if the word ends in two consonants.

help → helping talk → talking work → working
