	CONDITION	+	RESULT
<b>ZERO</b> conditional	If you stand in the rain, you get wet. If you heat ice, it melts.		
	PRESENT SIMPLE	+	PRESENT SIMPLE
<b>USES:</b> <i>Facts which are generally true or scientific facts</i> <i>The condition always has the same result</i>			
<b>FIRST</b> conditional	If it rains, we will cancel the trip. If you study, you will pass the exam.		
	PRESENT SIMPLE	+	WILL / WON'T + VERB
<b>USES:</b> <i>A possible situation in the future</i> <i>Predicting a likely result in the future (if the condition happens)</i>			
<b>SECOND</b> conditional	If I won the lottery, I would travel a lot. If they sold their house, they would be rich.		
	PAST SIMPLE	+	WOULD + VERB
<b>USES:</b> <i>Hypothetical or unlikely situations</i> <i>Unreal or improbable situation now or in the future</i>			
<b>THIRD</b> conditional	If you had studied, you would have passed the exam. If I hadn't been sick, I would have gone to your party.		
	PAST PERFECT	+	WOULD HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE
<b>USES:</b> <i>The person is imagining a different past</i> <i>Imaginary situation that did not happen</i>

CONDITIONALS	if clause (condition)	main clause (result)
<b>0 conditional</b> used for present, real/factual situations	present simple If I <u>study</u> hard,	present simple I always <u>pass</u> my exams.
<b>1st conditional</b> used for future real/factual situations	present simple If I <u>study</u> hard,	will + base verb I <u>will pass</u> my exams.
<b>2nd conditional</b> used for present or future unreal, imaginary situations	past simple If I <u>studied</u> hard,	would + base verb I <u>would pass</u> my exams.
<b>3rd conditional</b> used for past unreal, imaginary situations	past perfect If I <u>had studied</u> hard,	would have + past participle I <u>would have passed</u> my exams.
