-when used as a main verb-



Pronoun	Affirmative	Negative
I	I have	I don't have
you	you have	you don't have
he	he has	he doesn't have
she	she has	she doesn't have
it	it has	it doesn't have
we	we have	we don't have
they	they have	they don't have
you	you have	you don't have

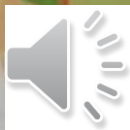

- Negative

Lili no tiene una casa pequeña.

Lili doesn't have a small house.

? -interrogative
