
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# Regular and irregular verbs

Spelling rules for the past simple of regular verbs:

- For the regular verbs, the simple past and the past participle are formed by adding -ed
  - jump – jumped
  - paint – painted
  - clean – cleaned
  - wait – waited
  - help – helped
  - play – played
  - fix – fixed
- For one syllable verbs that end in the consonant-vowel-consonant pattern, double the last consonant and add -ed.
  - chat – chatted
  - stop – stopped
  - beg – begged

- If the verb ends in -e, just add -d.
  - arrive – arrived
  - puzzle – puzzled
  - love – loved
- If the verb ends in -y, change the -y to i and add -ed.
  - cry – cried
  - fry – fried
  - study – studied
  - apply – applied
- If the verb ends in -y, preceded by a vowel, just add -ed.
  - enjoy – enjoyed
  - employ – employed
  - destroy – destroyed





# The past simple – affirmative



How do we form the past simple of regular verbs?

Most verbs add -ed:

- The children **played** football yesterday.
- We **finished** our breakfast on time.
- She **talked** so much about you



for verbs that end in -y after a consonant letter, change -y to -i, and add -ed

- (study – studied)
- (copy – copied)
- (try – tried)



for verbs that end in a vowel + consonant, double the consonant letter and add -ed

- (stop – stopped)
- (plan – planned)



some irregular verbs don't change their past simple form

- (quit – quit)
- (hit – hit)
- (hurt -hurt)

## Past Simple

**Definición:** El pasado simple es uno de estos tiempos verbales, presente en diferentes lenguas. La mención del pasado refiere a acciones que ya se realizaron con anterioridad (es decir, que ya fueron concretadas). En el castellano, el pasado simple también se conoce como pretérito perfecto simple o pretérito indefinido.

**Usos:** En inglés, hay dos tipos de Simple Past o de pasado simple (**el regular o el irregular**). Los verbos regulares forman el Simple Past añadiendo el sufijo **-ed** al infinitivo y los verbos irregulares forman su Simple Past sin seguir ninguna regla. Puedes hacer uso de la tabla de verbos proporcionada y verificar cómo se forma el pasado simple de muchos de los verbos en inglés.
