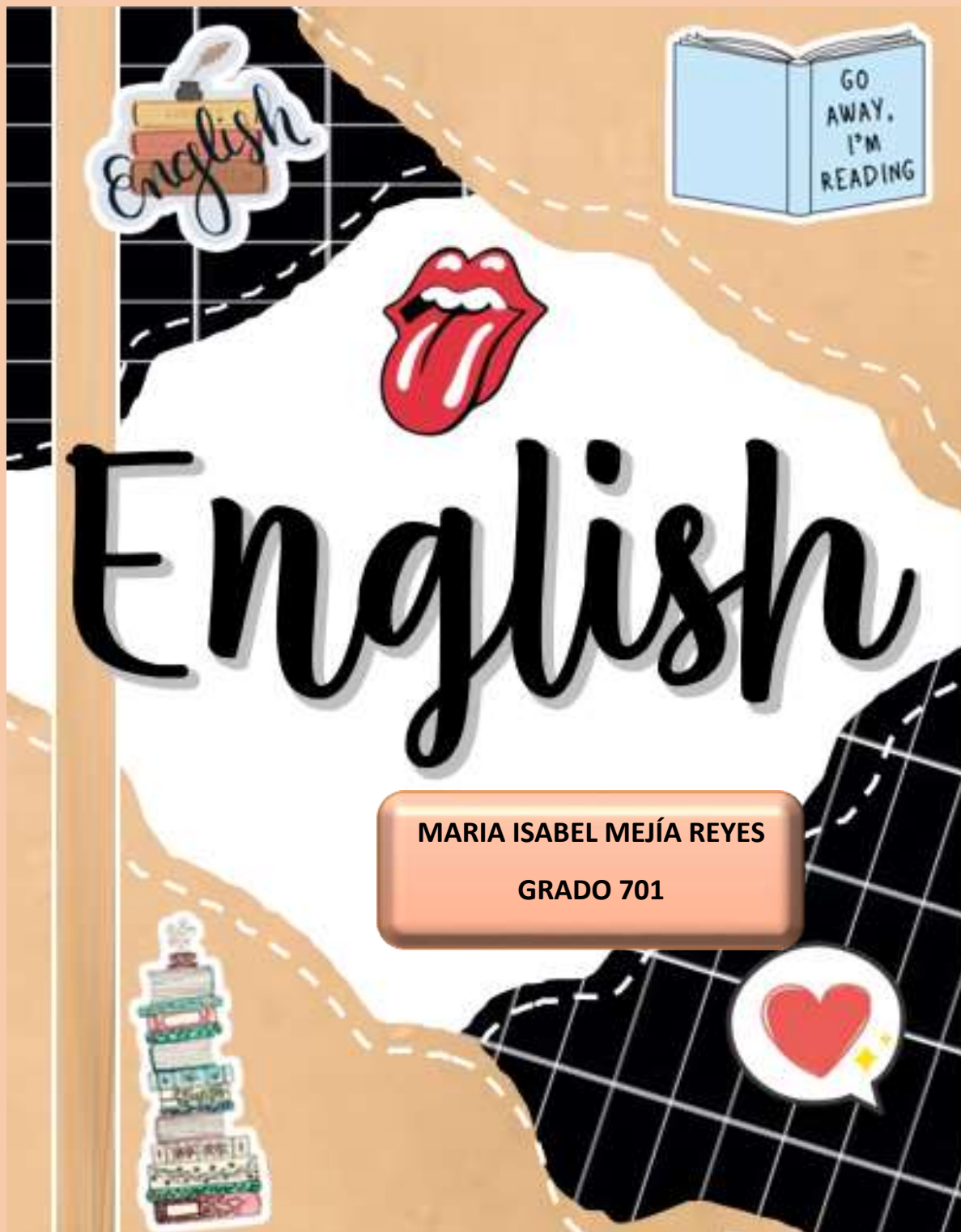


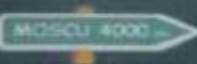

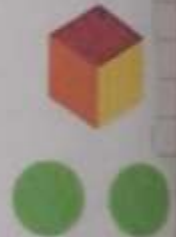

Life

Zahra Nemati is a 31-year-old Iranian woman practised Taekwondo and dreamed of competing in the Olympics, but in 2003 she was in a serious car accident and was left paralyzed. She couldn't jump and she couldn't practise taekwondo anymore. This made her feel both sad and disappointed because she couldn't continue to practise the sport she loved.

But, like many athletes, Zahra had plenty of motivation and decided to try a sport she could do in a wheelchair. She began to practise archery. Now, determined more than ever to compete at the Olympics, Zahra trained every day and was selected to represent Iran at the 2012 London Paralympics. There she became the first Iranian woman to win a Paralympic gold medal.

In 2016 Zahra carried her country's flag at the Brazilian Paralympics in recognition of her incredible achievements. As she led the Iranian team into the Paralympic stadium everyone could see the excitement and happiness in her face.

Zahra Nemati really is an amazing person and an inspiration to the rest of us.

Traducción "La Vida"

Zahra Nemati es una mujer iraní de 31 años que practicaba Taekwondo y soñaba con competir en los Juegos Olímpicos.

pero en 2003 sufrió un grave accidente automovilístico y quedó paralizada, no podía saltar y no podía seguir practicando taekwondo. Esto la hizo sentirse triste y decepcionada, porque no podía continuar practicando el deporte que amaba.

Pero, como muchos atletas, Zahra tenía mucha motivación y decidió probar un deporte que podía hacer en silla de ruedas: comenzó a practicar tiro con arco, ahora, más decidida que nunca a competir en los Juegos Olímpicos, Zahra entrenaba todos los días y fue seleccionada para representar a Irán en los Juegos Paralímpicos de Londres de 2012, donde se convirtió en la primera mujer iraní en ganar una medalla de oro Paralímpica.

En 2016, Zahra llevó la bandera de su país en los Juegos Paralímpicos de Brasil en reconocimiento a sus increíbles logros. Mientras conducía al equipo iraní al estadio Paralímpico, todos podían ver la emoción y la felicidad en su rostro.

Zahra Nemati es realmente una persona increíble y una inspiración para el resto de nosotros.
